

THE WEIGHTED TASK OF PRE-K TEACHING

Issues in equity and race are of great significance to the field of education and more research emerges that proves inequalities in classrooms and schools must be addressed. These inequalities can take shape in many different ways and are often never detected until the issues are highlighted by an outside source.

In the article, *The Weight Task of Pre-K Teaching*, Susanne Bouffard, author, describes the inequities in preschool classrooms and the glaring differences in educational practices between low and high socio-economic students. Bouffard states, "There were programs in poor neighborhoods where children delighted in learning vocabulary from field trips to historical sites, and classrooms in affluent places that were fancier than some colleges. The programs that left me with the starkest impression were those that used a strict, basics-only approach, where teachers lectured at children and the children parroted back what they said. These programs are more common in low-income neighborhoods than they are in more-affluent ones, according to research and my own reporting." This article is an excellent resource for helping you begin to have the conversation about equity in your setting.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

House Bill (HB) 1091 and 7055 have introduced significant changes to School Readiness and VPK. See below highlights from each bill.

Highlights of HB 1091 (SR)

- Program assessment
- Minimum quality thresholds for contracting and improving plans
- Child assessment (including ability for parent to monitor child's development in statewide system)
- Differential payments
- Local eligibility priorities based on needs of community

Highlights of HB 7055 (SR and VPK)

- Coalition may refuse to contract with provider cited with a Class I violation
- Coalition may revoke a provider's eligibility to deliver school readiness and VPK
