The free event is put on by Kids Incorporated, a nonprofit that provides Early Head Start, nutrition, health and other services to families in the Big Bend. It was created to provide







Included is \$9,863,095,000 for programs under the Head Start Act, an increase of \$610 million over the fiscal year (FY) 2017 funding level. Of this increase, \$216 million provides grantees a 2.6 percent cost-of-living adjustment (COLA), \$260 million to support grantees increasing their hours of program operations,
