## Description

These office hours will provide an opportunity to connect with national experts and peers around issues related to EPRR and mental health. Office hours will be open to recipients who have experienced a disaster or emergency, or who live in an area prone to natural disasters and would like to discuss this with or listen to colleagues. Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) specialists are also invited to these discussions. These targeted office hours are offered as a follow-up to the institute held in December 2022 on site.

Mental Health EPRR office hours will be held weekly on Tuesdays at noon (ET) for one hour.

Office hours are a conversation; no agenda needed. Each session will provide the opportunity for participants to identify topic areas to explore in subsequent sessions. We hope to:

- Recognize cumulative stress and provide strategies to build resilience
- Deepen understanding of how to access and effectively use mental health consultation resources
- Assist recipients in identifying mental health needs and possible resources that could be supported through grants focused on mental health
- Encourage TTA and recipients to explore possible next steps and facilitate identifying and planning what they need to get to next steps
- Strategize how to build mental health supports into all phases of EPRR
- Empower TTA specialists to effectively support recipients experiencing the effects of disasters
